The only way public funds could be used to accomplish what you are asking, is if you were given a citation for the property deeming the property a hazard. You choose not to abate the property, after a certain amount of time an abatement warrant is issued authorizing the use of public resources on your private land to abate the hazard and then you would be billed or your property levied to cover the cost of said abatement. The other option in using public monies for abatement is you enter into a contract between you and a public entity to cover the cost of the work. As far as the risk to the property catching fire, it is always a

possibility of trespassers or a natural caused fire occurring that would necessitate the need for a fire department response to suppress and control the fire. Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association confirms that the County is following the correct legal procedure for expanding Service Zone FP-5

In a recent letter to a San Bernardino County resident, the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association (the State's leading taxpayers' rights organization) offered a legal opinion on the process being followed by the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors and the San Bernardino County Fire Protection District in their efforts to expand Service Zone FP-5 countywide. HJTA confirms that the County is going above and beyond by doing more than is legally required to allow for public input and to ensure that affected property owners have the ultimate say. The letter in its entirety:

Thank you for your inquiry to the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association. Your inquiry relates to the proposal by the San Bernardino County Fire Department to annex property into Service Zone FP-5, which is subject to an existing tax of \$157 per year. We have received inquiries from many people in your area wanting to know whether they are entitled to a vote on the annexation, or a vote on paying the tax currently collected in Zone FP-5.

It is understandable that people would expect to have an election on either the annexation or the tax, or both. Ordinarily, Proposition 218 provides a right to vote on new taxes. Enacted by the voters of California in 1996, Proposition 218 added article 13C to the state constitution, which requires 2/3 voter approval for new special taxes, such as taxes dedicated to fire protection.

In similar fashion, property owners would ordinarily be able to force an election on whether their property should be annexed into a special district. The county Local Agency Formation Commission, or LAFCO, would ordinarily review annexation proposals. A proposed annexation could be defeated outright by a majority of the affected voters filing written protests. If less than a majority protested, but protests were received from at least 25% of the registered voters owning at least 25% of the assessed value of land within the territory to be annexed, then the annexation would be placed on the ballot for an election.

In your case, there is a special set of statutes, Health & Safety Code sections <u>13950</u> et seq., that exclude LAFCO from any decision by a fire district to form, revise, annex, or dissolve zones within its jurisdiction. The reason I mentioned LAFCO, however, is that the courts have ruled, in a case called Citizens Assn. of Sunset Beach v. Orange Co. LAFCO (2012) 209 Cal.App.4th 1182, that Proposition 218's right to vote on taxes does not apply to LAFCO annexations.

Here, the San Bernardino County Fire Department has opted to follow a process that mirrors LAFCO's protest procedure, even though the Health & Safety Code statutes do not require it. I believe the Department was advised by legal counsel to follow this LAFCO-like procedure in order to cloak itself with the decision in the Sunset Beach case, which held Proposition 218 inapplicable to LAFCO annexations. The Department was probably also advised that, by applying the LAFCO protest procedure, it could cloak itself with the protection of an Attorney General opinion which found that the LAFCO protest procedure is the functional equivalent of a Proposition 218 vote on paying the new taxes.

In light of the Sunset Beach decision, the Attorney General opinion, and the Fire Department's voluntary application of a

procedure that offers property owners a chance to force an election on the proposed annexation, HJTA believes litigation is inadvisable.



# A wrong-way fire fee

The San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors recently approved a plan to expand Fire Protection Service Zone 5. This will mandate a fee of \$157.26 to be charged to property taxes (increasing up to 3 percent per year). There are three serious problems with this: 1. The fee will be the same for every parcel, regardless of value. Contrast this to fire insurance, for which the owner of a mansion pays more than the resident of a typical home.

The proposed fire fee, like insurance, is a form of fire protection — yet a billionaire's estate, which has more to protect, is to be chargedthe same fee as a trailer on a plot in Wonder Valley.

- 2. The fee will be put to a vote by the people only if 25 percent of affected property owners protest it. However, only bare notices of the fee have been mailed out, not protest forms (you have to go to <a href="https://www.sbcfire.org">www.sbcfire.org</a> or phone 211 and find them!).
- 3. If the fire fee goes through, it may encourage the imposition of other special 'fees' on every parcel, regardless of value. What other fees might be coming?

Good afternoon Mr. Rennie,

On behalf of the San Bernardino County Fire District, it has been our pleasure in answering your questions related to FP-5 expansion.

Your correspondence was referred to me for response. The San Bernardino County Fire Protection District has long valued it's working relationship with Morongo Basin Ambulance. In fact, we often times provide cooperative efforts by both the Fire District Paramedics and MBA paramedics in treatment and transport or critically ill or injured patients. This can occur in a variety of manners depending on whom arrives first and the severity of the patient condition upon assessment. I personally have treated patients, as a Fire District paramedic, in the back of a Morongo Basin Ambulance while transporting to High Desert Medical Center as the patient was critical and both paramedics were required.

The Fire District is an authorized provider for prehospital Advanced Life Support capability in both a transport and non-transport capacity as statutorily outlined under the California Health and Safety Code, State of California EMSA and ICEMA. In fact, our paramedics are accredited with the same requirements as your paramedics through ICEMA and are also licensed through the State of California EMSA.

We do not disagree with your statement about your primary role and responsibility as outlined as the "201" transport provider for your assigned areas. I believe this is what you are referencing related to "Mutual Aid" below. The same remains for our areas across the county that we provide transport services.

The Fire District regularly provides prehospital Advanced Life Support care to over 18,000 square miles of the county, serving over 1.1 million citizens, often times in conjunction with other private ambulance transport providers.

I hope this has assisted you in clearing any confusions you may have about the delivery related to prehospital service delivery.
